

RESOLUTION 85- 62

WHEREAS, County resolution 85-55 directed that the following proposition be placed on the ballot at a previously called special election:

Shall the Board of County Commissioners of St. Johns County, Florida, be increased from five to seven members, with five of the seven members to be elected to office from single-member districts by electors residing in each of those districts only, with the two remaining members being elected by all electors within the county at large:

WHEREAS, the supervisor of elections for St. Johns County has scheduled the election for Tuesday, June 11, 1985,

WHEREAS, Florida Statute 124.011(11) requires that the resolution adopted by the Board of County Commissioners under paragraph 3(a) of §124.011 which presents the proposed revision to the electorate for approval shall specify an orderly method and procedure for implementing the revision contemplated in the resolution.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, THIS 23rd DAY OF APRIL, 1985, BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF ST. JOHNS COUNTY, FLORIDA, as follows:

Section 1. St. Johns County Resolution 85-55 is amended by adding the following sections thereto:

Section 2. The Board of County Commissioners of St. Johns County hereby directs the following proposition to be placed on the ballot at the previously called June 11, 1985 special election:

Shall the Board of County Commissioners of St. Johns County, Florida, be increased from five to seven members, with five of the seven members to be elected to office from single-member districts by electors residing in each of those districts only, with the two remaining members being elected by all electors within the county at large:

Section 3. In the event a majority of the qualified electors voting on the above proposition approves such proposition, then, and in that event,

County Commissioners of St. Johns County shall be elected in the following manner:

- A. All County Commissioners who were elected prior to June 11, 1985 shall serve their full terms.
- B. Commencing in 1986, the two county commission districts wherein the existing county commission four year terms are scheduled to end will become single-member districts. The commissioner elected for each such district in 1986 and thereafter shall be elected to four year terms by electors residing in such district only.
- C. Commencing in 1988, the three county commission districts wherein the existing county commission four year terms are scheduled to end will become single-member districts. The commissioners elected for each such district in 1988 and thereafter shall be elected to four year terms by electors residing in such district only.
- D. Commencing in 1986 there shall be two countywide county commission districts which may be referred to as "countywide county commission district A" and "countywide county commission district B". In 1986 and thereafter, a county commissioner for countywide county commission district A shall be elected to a four year term by electors within the county at large. In 1986 a county commissioner for countywide county commission district B shall be elected to a two year term by electors within the county at large. In 1988 and thereafter a county commissioner for countywide county commission district B shall be elected to a four year term by electors within the county at large.
