

Dear Chairman Waldron:

In July 1989, this Division will start the process to update the Statewide 9-1-1 Emergency Telephone Number Plan (see attached scheduled). This update is necessary, considering the changes in technology and the existing status of 9-1-1 throughout the State.

It will be necessary during the update of the plan to have frequent discussions, both orally and in writing, with each county. This activity is necessary to ensure that the plan update reflects the desires of local governments, appropriate technical and administrative standards, efficient and effective procedures and the present and future configuration of each county's 9-1-1 system.

By statute, the Board of County Commissioners is responsible for its county 9-1-1 system. Accordingly, our practice has been to address all 9-1-1 related correspondence directly to the Board Chairperson. We now feel there is a justified need to broaden our scope of communications within each county. It is our opinion that direct correspondence with the appropriate county 9-1-1 coordinator would be beneficial to both the Division and the County. We respectfully request that the Board consider delegating the responsibility to the appropriate 9-1-1 county official. Our records indicate that your 9-1-1 Coordinator is Sgt. John Bauer. At the pleasure of the Board, we would like to establish a coordinating line of communication with this individual. Please let us know if this suggestion is acceptable.

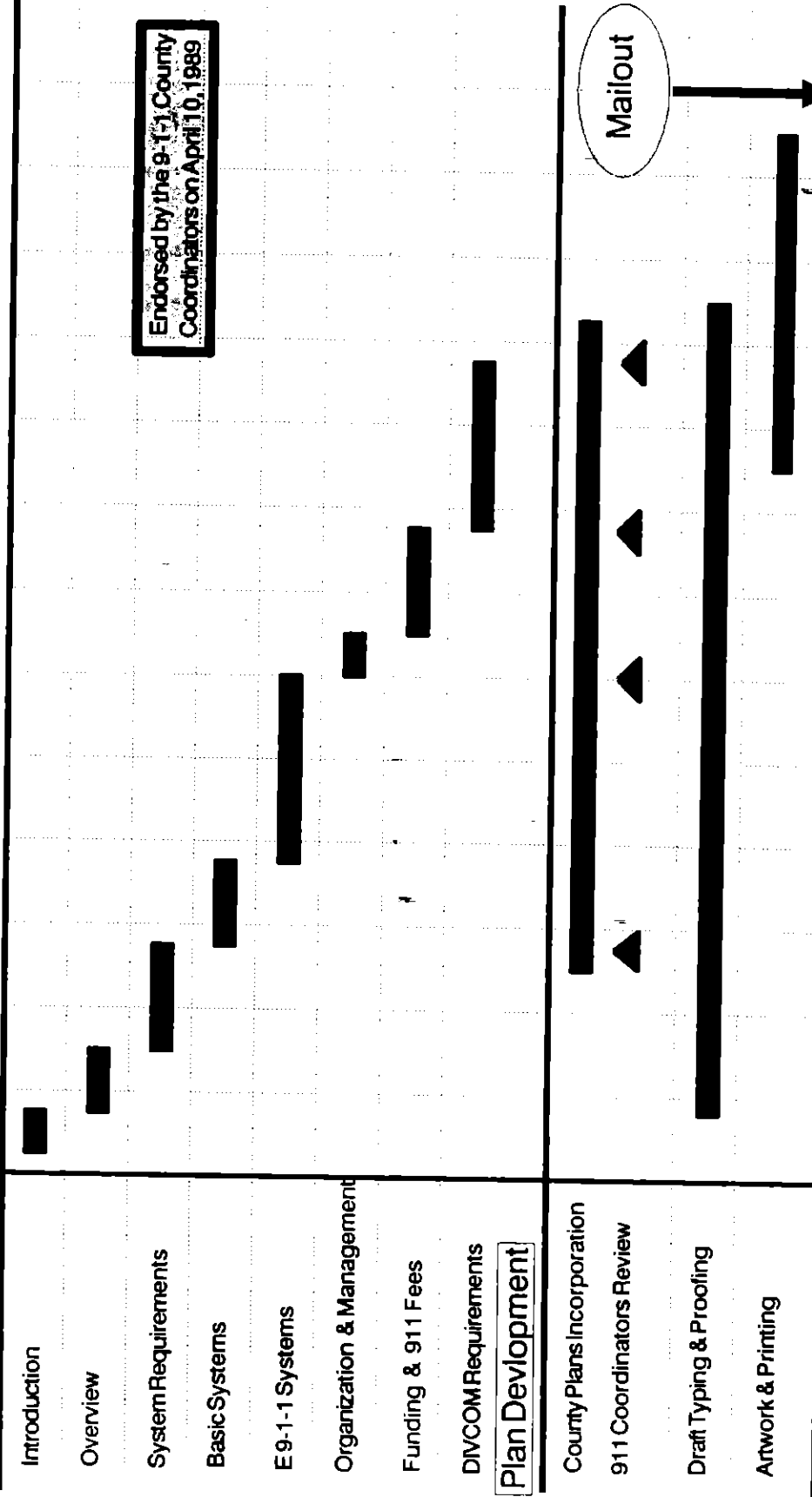

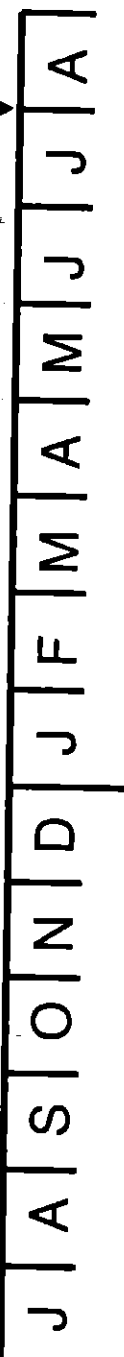
STATE OF FLORIDA 9-1-1 PLAN SCHEDULE
