

RESOLUTION NO. 91-07

WHEREAS, the Cedar Bay Cogenerating Plant, currently proposed for construction on the north side of Jacksonville will significantly increase the level of carbon monoxide, nitrogen oxides, lead, beryllium, mercury, fluorides, and sulfuric acid mist in the environment, and

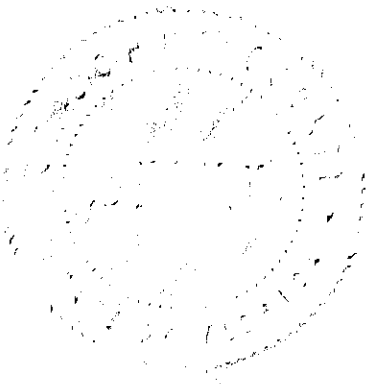
WHEREAS, the withdrawal of up to 7 million gallons of water per day from the Florida Aquifer for cooling purposes poses a potential threat to drinking water reserves, and

WHEREAS, the Environmental Protection Agency has acknowledged this project could result in significant salt water intrusion into the aquifer thereby affecting other wells within its vicinity

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the St. Johns County Board of County Commissioners wishes to join Duval County in opposing the construction and operation of the Cedar Bay Cogeneration Plant Project.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the St. Johns County Board of County Commissioners urges Governor Lawton Chiles and the Cabinet to vote against the application by AES Cedar Bay, Inc. that would permit a cogeneration plant to be placed in Duval County.
