

RESOLUTION 94- 37

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF ST. JOHNS COUNTY AMENDING RESOLUTION 92-191 WHICH REQUIRES AN ELECTION TO BE HELD ON NOVEMBER 8, 1994 TO DETERMINE WHETHER OR NOT TO RETURN THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS BACK TO A FIVE MEMBER BOARD ELECTED AT LARGE. THIS AMENDMENT MODIFIES THE BALLOT QUESTION IN ORDER TO DESCRIBE THE PRESENT PROCEDURE USED TO ELECT A SEVEN MEMBER BOARD SO THAT THE VOTERS ARE MORE FULLY ADVISED OF THE CHANGE THAT WOULD OCCUR IF THE QUESTION PASSES. IT ALSO REVISES THE EXHIBIT A NOTICE TO REFLECT THIS AMENDMENT AND TO ELIMINATE ANY DOUBT AS TO THE ABILITY OF ABSENTEE VOTERS TO VOTE ON THE ISSUE.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF ST. JOHNS COUNTY, FLORIDA as follows:

Section 1. Resolution 92-191 passed by the Board of County Commissioners of St. Johns County, Florida on November 10, 1992 is hereby amended as follows:

A. Section 2 of Resolution 92-191 is deleted and the following is added and substituted in its stead:

"Section 2. The Board of County Commissioners of St. Johns County, Florida, hereby directs the following proposition to be placed on the ballot at the 1994 general election which is scheduled for November 8, 1994:

WHETHER TO RETURN THE COUNTY COMMISSION  
BACK TO A FIVE MEMBER BOARD ELECTED AT  
LARGE.

Shall the Board of County  
Commissioners of St. Johns County,  
Florida, be returned from a seven  
member board composed of five members  
elected through single member district  
voting and two members elected through  
countywide voting to a five member  
board, with each board member to  
reside in a different district and  
with each board member to be elected  
to office by all electors within the  
county at large?
