

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF ST. JOHNS COUNTY DIRECTING THE COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR TO AMEND THE BOARD'S ADMINISTRATIVE POLICIES AND PROCEDURES FOR THE ASSESSMENT OF ROADWAY SURFACE AND ROADWAY DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENT PROGRAMS INITIATED BY LANDOWNERS' PETITIONS TO ALLOW AND ESTABLISH PROJECT COST SHARING ON AN APPROXIMATE 1/3 - 1/3 - 1/3 RATIO.

WHEREAS, on December 15, 1993 the Board of County Commissioners of St. Johns County adopted by motion Administrative Policies and Procedures For The Assessment Of Roadway Surface and Roadway Drainage Improvement Programs Initiated By Landowner's Petitions; and

WHEREAS, on July 29, 1994 the County Administrator amended those Administrative Polices and Procedures in the manner authorized by Section III of said policies and procedures; and

WHEREAS, said Administrative Polices and Procedures, as amended (hereinafter referred to as the "**Road Assessment Paving Program**") stated the following:

"The County does not share in the cost of the project and the cost will be born 100% by the property owners. This procedure and program is independent of and not governed by the County's Road Improvement Assessment ordinance # 76-21 as amended."; and

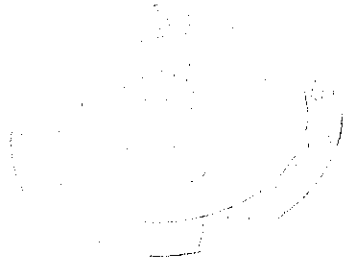
WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of St. Johns County, Florida now desires that the County and applicable landowners will share in the costs of the projects in an approximate 1/3 - 1/3 - 1/3 ratio similar to the cost sharing ratio previously utilized by the County under St. Johns County Ordinance #76-21, as amended.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF ST. JOHNS COUNTY, FLORIDA as follows:

Section 1. The County Administrator is hereby directed to amend the County's Road Assessment Paving Program to allow and establish project cost sharing on an approximate 1/3 - 1/3 - 1/3 ratio (with the County paying an approximate 1/3 of the costs of each project) that is similar to the landowner/County 1/3 - 1/3 - 1/3 cost sharing ratio that has been previously used by the County under St. Johns County Ordinance #76-21, as amended.

Section 2. Notwithstanding the references herein to St. Johns County Ordinance #76-21, as amended, it is the intent of the Board that the Road Assessment Paving Program be, and remain, independent of and not governed by St. Johns County Ordinance #76-21, as amended.
