

RESOLUTION 2000 – 89

A RESOLUTION OF ST. JOHNS COUNTY, FLORIDA, BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS THAT CONSISTS OF A PROCLAMATION EXTENDING A STATE OF LOCAL EMERGENCY PROCLAIMED BY ST. JOHNS COUNTY RESOLUTION 2000-80 ON JUNE 6, 2000 AS PROVIDED BY PART I, CHAPTER 252, FLORIDA STATUTES AND BY ST. JOHNS COUNTY, FLORIDA, ORDINANCE #94-25.

WHEREAS, exceedingly hot, dry, parched, and windy conditions have prevailed throughout St. Johns County, Florida (the County), for the past several weeks; and

WHEREAS, as a result of said conditions numerous brush and forest wildfires have been ignited throughout the County; and

WHEREAS, on June 6, 2000, the St. Johns County Board of County Commissioners proclaimed a state of local emergency by adopting Resolution 2000-80; and

WHEREAS, said conditions and the danger of brush and wildfires is expected to continue.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AND PROCLAIMED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF ST. JOHNS COUNTY, FLORIDA:

By virtue of the authority of Chapter 252, Florida Statutes, Part I, and all other applicable laws, the Board does hereby promulgate the following Proclamation.

Section I

The state of local emergency that was proclaimed by the St. Johns County Board of County Commissioners on June 6, 2000, by adopting Resolution 2000-80, is hereby extended for seven (7) more days due to the continued effects of dry conditions and the numerous fires that have been burning in the County.
