

RESOLUTION NO. 2003- 40

**A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF ST. JOHNS COUNTY, FLORIDA AMENDING THE FISCAL YEAR 2003 GENERAL REVENUE AND EXPENDITURE BUDGETS TO RECEIVE UNANTICIPATED REVENUE AND AUTHORIZE ITS EXPENDITURE THROUGH ITS EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT DEPARTMENT.**

**WHEREAS**, the County has, from time to time, received a grant of funds from the State of Florida to provide certain services related to its Emergency Management functions; and

**WHEREAS**, the County operating budget is annually approved without knowledge of the actual amount of any grant funds which may be received by the General Fund; and

**WHEREAS**, St. Johns County, Florida, when preparing the budget for Fiscal Year 2003 did not anticipate receiving grant funds from the State of Florida, Department of Community Affairs above and beyond those projected by the Emergency Management Department; and

**WHEREAS**, St. Johns County's Emergency Management Department has been awarded a grant whose amount was not known prior to the beginning of Fiscal Year 2003; and

**WHEREAS**, the County has been granted such funds by the State of Florida to develop a Preparedness and Consequence Management Plan for possible terrorist attacks and other purposes; and

**WHEREAS**, the amount the State is providing St. Johns County is \$50,000.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of County Commissioners of St. Johns County that:

1. The above recitals are hereby adopted as findings of fact,
2. The General Fund Revenue and Expenditure budgets shall be adjusted to account for unanticipated funds received from the State of Florida in the amount of \$50,000 for Fiscal Year 2003.
